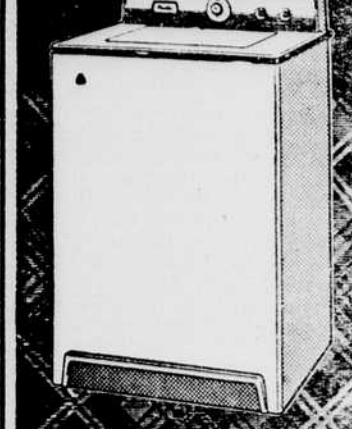

Regular annual dividends of \$262,000,000 will be paid to 5,300,000 World War I and II GI insurance policyholders this year, Roswell K. Porter, of the Asheville Veterans Administration office in the City Building, announced today.

The dividends will be paid as near as possible to the anniversary date of each policy during calendar year 1958. For example, if a policy was issued any June 1, the anniversary date will be June 1, 1958.

The dividend declarations do not include the non-participating post-Korea type of GI insurance since the law makes no provision for dividend payments on those policies.

World War I and II policyholders who will share in the dividends are requested not to inquire in advance about payments so as not to delay the processing time.
