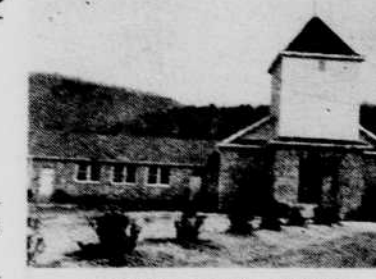

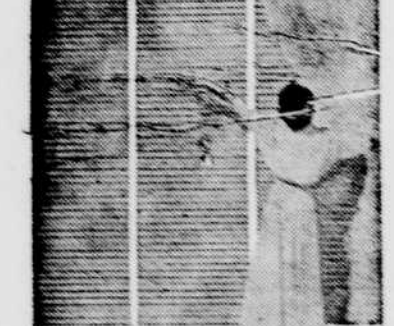
sively shown that theater need not be realistic to be absorbing or effective. "Dark of the Moon" is an illustrated and plaintive folksong with dance, or a dance with folk music. Its direct, salty, Anglo-Saxon language is blended with the poetry of Southern folkways.

The drama ran for 300-odd performances in 1945. . . . Dealing with the legend of Barbara Allen and the witch boy she fell in love with, the drama subtly puts one under its Southern spell, and conjure women and witchery take on a reality. The authors have a marvelous ear for Southern speech patterns, surely one of the most expressive idioms in the nation. They have deftly injected hymns and folk tunes into the script (examples: "Old Time Religion," "Lonesome Valley," and "Down in the Valley").

"The production is stunning," the review summarizes.

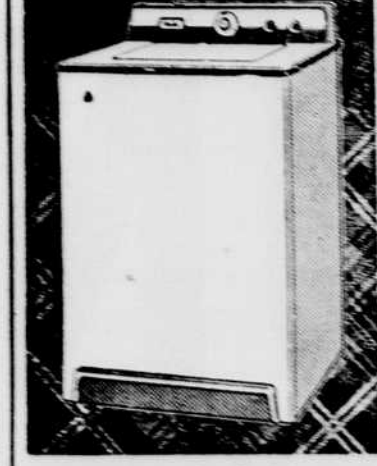
