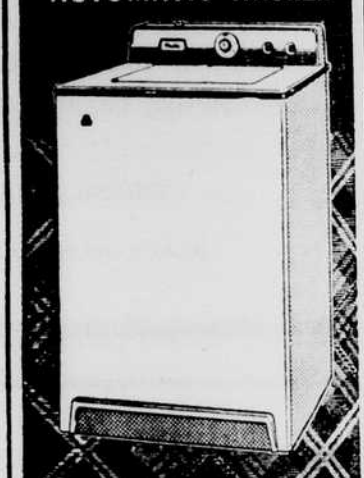
Special speaker for the Winston-Salem meeting was Assistant Postmaster General John M. McKibbin, Jr., whose forceful remarks were widely read all over the state.
