Black Mountain received nation-wide publicity, the kind that can't be bought at any price, last week when a native son, Laurence E. Brown, was installed as president of the National Sheriffs' association at the conclusion of the 18th annual convention in Philadelphia.



This means that for the next year our community will be in the national spotlight as Sheriff Brown guides the activities of the 3000 members in the 48 states.

This is a great honor for the Swannanoa Valley, Buncombe county, and North Carolina. It is one more step in the success ladder which covers more than 30 years of service. The Black Mountain native has been elected to the office and has spent more time as sheriff than any other man in our state's history.

His record is too well known to all to be repeated here, but during his more than a quarter of a century as "High Sheriff" no major crime in the county has gone unsolved and in recent years the junior deputy program in Buncombe has been so successful that it has attracted the attention of groups in many states.

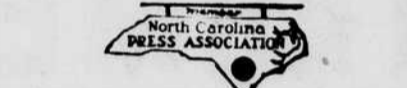
