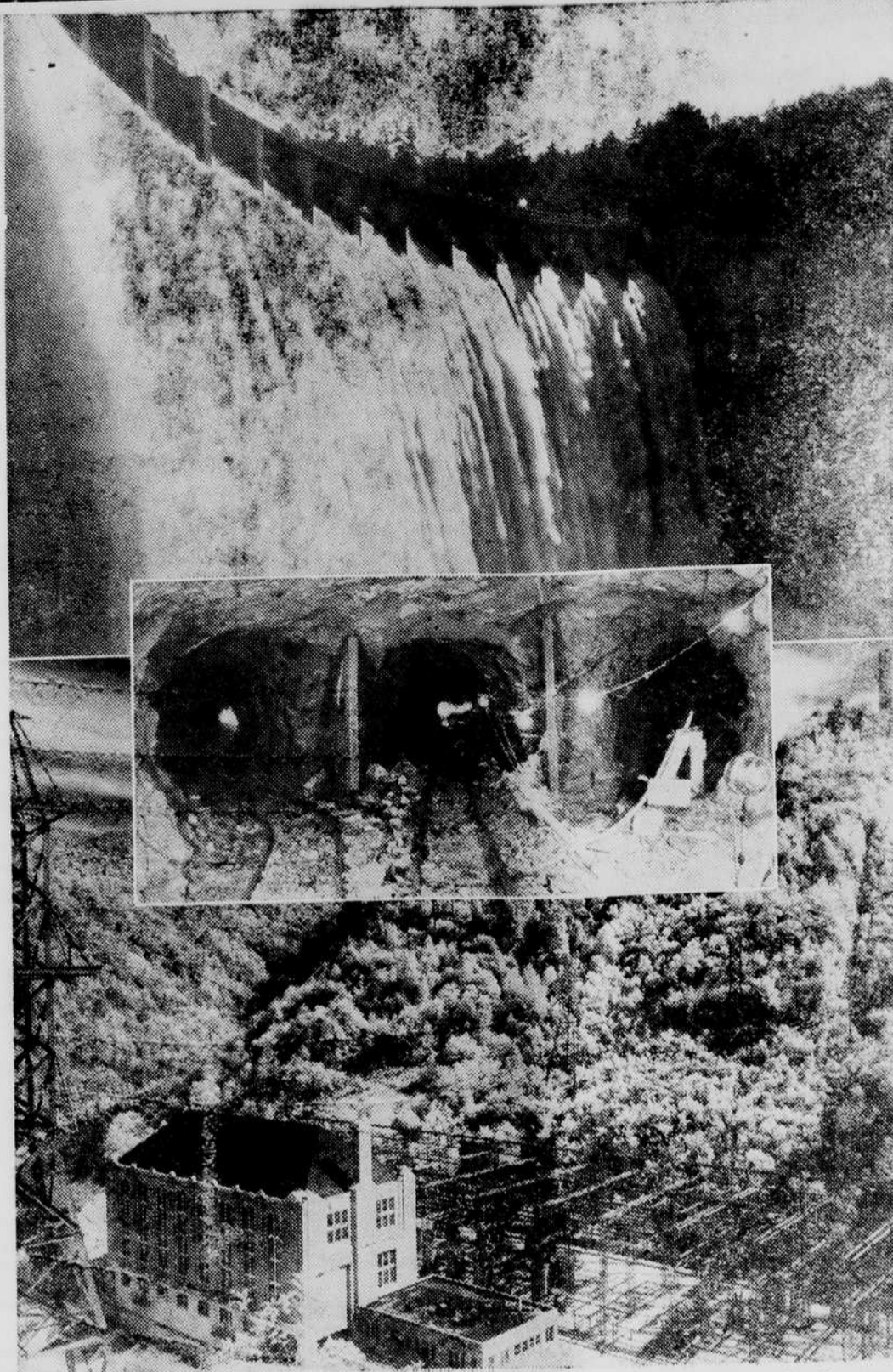

PIONEERING POWER PROJECT—Carolina Power & Light Company gained national recognition with its Waterville hydroelectric development on the Pigeon River. The dam (top) had the highest head of water east of the Mississippi, and a tunnel (inset) was punched through six miles of mountain to deliver water to the generating plant (below). The Waterville unit, later named for Vice-President C. S. Walters, went into operation in 1930. It has a capacity of 145,000 horsepower.

The entire parking situation in Black Mountain was discussed by a group of business and professional men who met in the office of Robert E. Eckles. M. E. Rondel, who called the meeting, presided.

After hearing the views of those present, Charlie Spencer was named chairman of a committee to draw up a map of city streets, outlining what it was hoped would develop a permanent plan of parking for the benefit of tourists, as well as regular residents. Ralph Reed and W. W. Early were to serve with Mr. Spencer, and the final draft of the committee's plans was due to go to the Mayor and City council.

W. W. White was elected director for life of the local Lions club after having served as secretary of the Black Mountain club and as cabinet secretary for this district of Lions International.

P. O. RULES FOR OVERSEAS PARCELS ARE NOW RELAXED

Postmaster General Arthur E. Summerfield announces that size and weight limitations on air parcels to overseas military post offices have been greatly liberalized, effective July 1.

Air parcels have been limited to two pounds and a combined length and girth of 30 inches. Now such parcels for most overseas military post offices may weigh up to 70 pounds and have combined length and girth up to 100 inches.

However, parcels destined for military post offices located in certain countries will be limited to 50 pounds and 72 inches length and girth combined because of internal regulations in these countries which makes such limitations necessary.

Questions about mailing conditions for specific military post offices can be answered by the local postmaster.

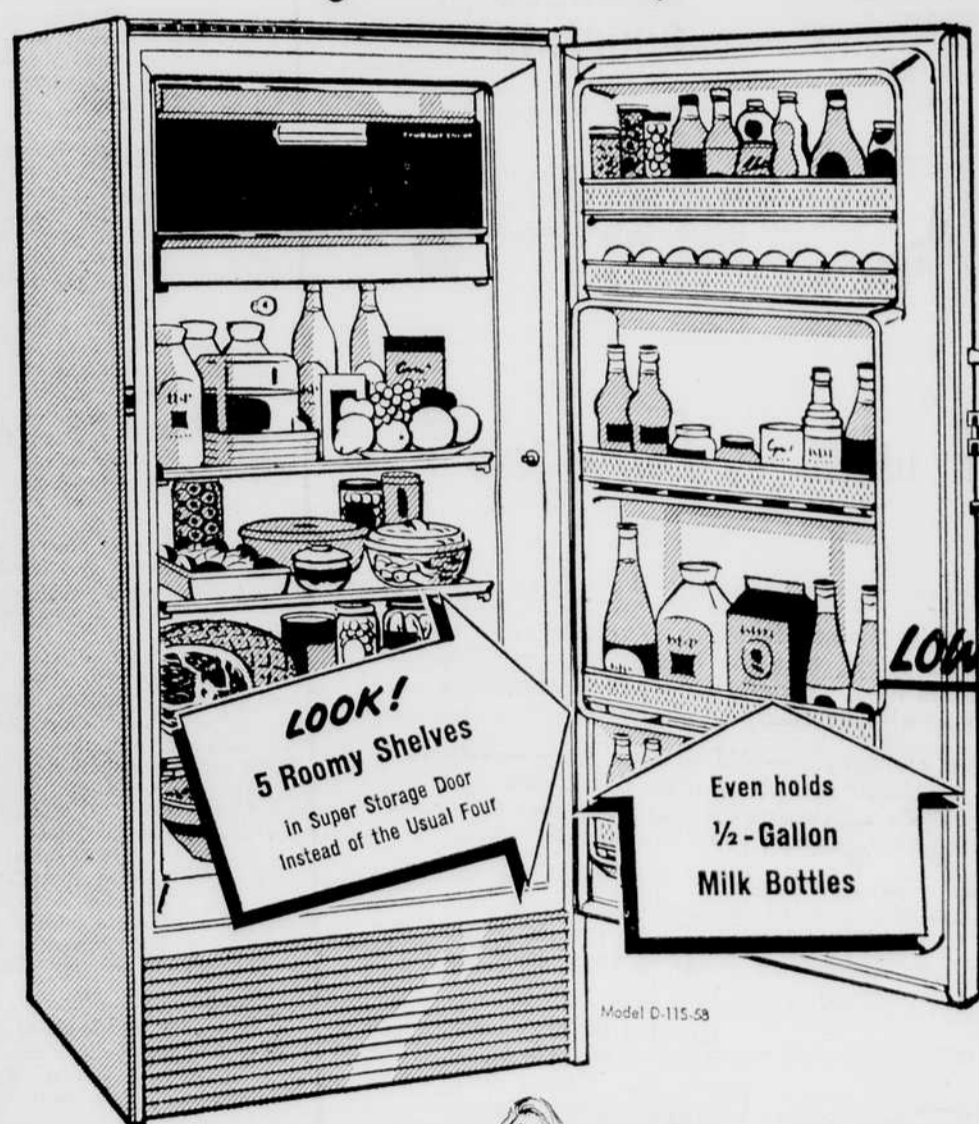
