



PIONEERING POWER PROJECT-Carolina Power & Light Company gained national recognition with its Waterville hydroelectric development on the Pigeon River. The dam (top) had the highest head of water east of the Mississippi, and a tunnel (inset) was punched through six miles of mountain to deliver water to the generating plant (below). The Waterville unit, later named for Vice-President C. S. Walters, went into operation in 1930. It has a capacity of 145,000 horsepower.


