Rev. Dr. Francis Whitlock Gregg of Rock Hill, died on Dec. 22 in Rock Hill. He was born in Florence, S. C., Dec. 1, 1872. He studied at the Citadel, Charleston, and at Columbus Theological seminary and was ordained for the ministry by Bethel Presbytery in May 1899.

During his long ministry he served churches in South Carolina and for 34 years he was pastor of the First Presbyterian church, Rock Hill. He retired in 1947. He also had been stated clerk of the Presbytery and was moderator of South Carolina Synod in 1941. He has often visited in Montreat with his daughter, Miss Frances Gregg, who is hostess of the South Carolina home here.

Karl Snyder, who lives with his parents on Alabama terrace, is listed on the "Roll of Honor for 1958" for having perfectly recited the Westminster shorter catechism. He is the only one from Montreat on this list which was published in the "Christian Observer", Jan. 28. This paper has been of continuous publication for 145 years.
