Local Service Man is Injured On Foreign Duty

Sp. 4/c Ralph E. Greenlee, 32nd Signal Battalion corps, APO 175, recently lost a leg in an accident while on duty in Germany.

Driving a truck on icy roads during maneuvers, he was unable to prevent the vehicle from sliding into a ditch. He got out and walked to the back of the truck to see what could be done, when an oncoming gasoline truck also skidded, pinning Ralph to his own truck and amputating his left leg then and there.

A letter written to the boy's parents by Chaplain J. W. Mankin of the same Signal corps, said, "It was only Ralph's quick thinking which saved his own life and that of others. We are proud of him. He is a fine boy and is meeting this trouble with faith and a wonderful spirit, for which we thank God."

Ralph is the son of Mr. and Mrs. J. H. Greenlee, now of the Grove-stone section, and lived all his life at Ridgecrest. He has made a good record in the army and lacked only a short time of finishing his term of service. He is now in 98th General hospital overseas, where he will remain for about two months, after which he will be sent to Walter Reed hospital to complete recovery and rehabilitation.
