Almanac Is Available At S. Bell Office

Household conveniences that have contributed to the comfort and well-being of Americans over the past three centuries are featured in the 1960 edition of the Telephone Almanac which is now available to Southern Bell customers in Black Mountain.

W. R. Cooke, Jr., local Southern Bell manager, said that the informative booklet may be obtained free upon request at the company's business office.

The Almanac cover features a homemaker in a modern kitchen, and the 12 calendar pages carry illustrations of significant inventions that have made life easier and more pleasant in homes of the past and present.

Among the conveniences described and pictured are the early American "Betty lamp" used for lighting, the 18th century Franklin stove used for heating, and the Victorian punkah — a large man-powered fan used for cooling.

Other inventions include the washing machine, commercial food canning, the sewing machine, and the telephone.

The Almanac also tells of current progress in the Bell system. It describes the new ground station at the Bell Laboratories, where scientists are conducting experiments in sending and receiving telephone messages by way of man-made satellites. There are other interesting stories about undersea cable progress, Bell System defense work and other developments of interest to telephone users.

Also featured in the Almanac are sun and moon tables, a complete 1960 calendar, and historical events for each day of the year.



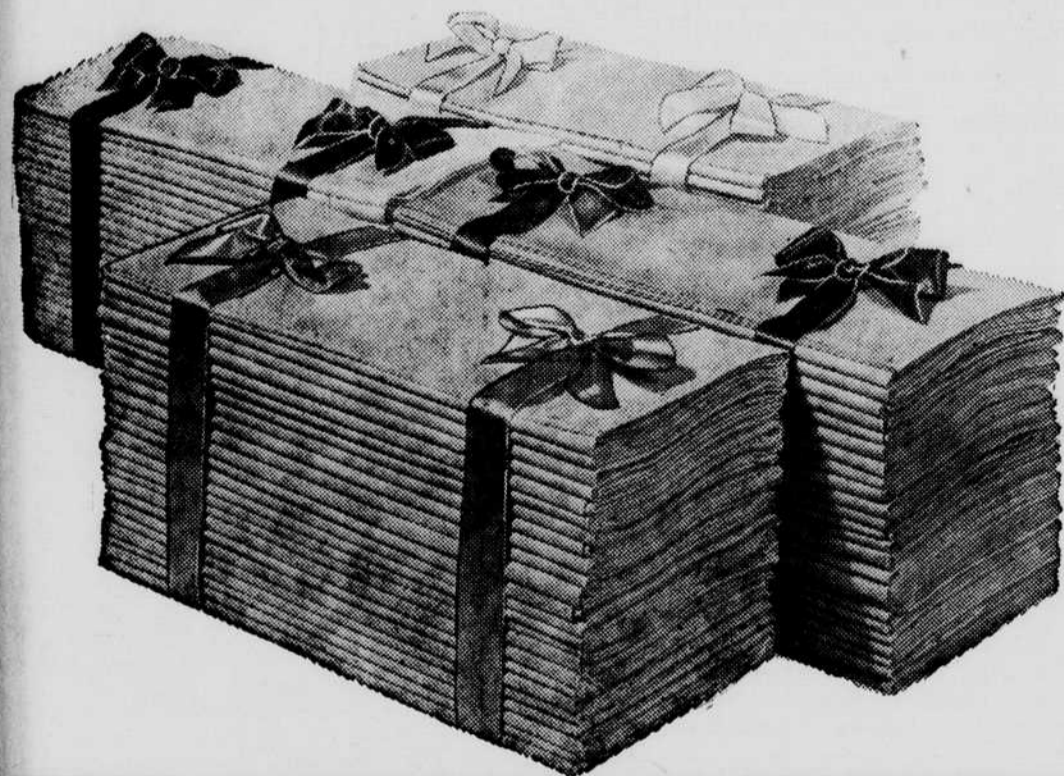
