which were erected by the North Carolina State Highway commission in Swannanoa some time ago must be observed on and after Monday, March 28, it was announced

The restricted areas for parking were established in Swannanoa in June, 1959, for the convenience of the public. The reports are that the "No Parking" signs have not been observed as closely as the Highway Department thought necessary.

In a recent letter to a leader in the community, H. C. Rhudy, traffic engineer with the State Highway Commission, pointed out that the Commission's efforts "to improve traffic conditions in the Swannanoa Community have resulted in little or no improve-

ment whatsoever. "We were promised in June, 1959, that this community would be in a position to have no parking restrictions enforced if we would have the necessary ordinances enacted and erect signs. We are of the opinion that the "No Parking" signs should be removed if this community cannot obtain enforcement from the Highway Patrol or a local dep-
