## **Bifocal Time Comes For** Most of Us

"It's happened, says the unhappy woman in the cartoon. "Bifocals!" Well, yes, it's true. The need for bifocals is one of the signs of advancing age. But doing without bifocals won't keep you young. People over forty are particularly liable to the eye disglaucoma. Normally, fluid is constantly pouring into the inside of the eyeball and draining off through a special channel. and treated. As glaucoma progresses, vision becomes blurred and lights seem to have a rainbow ring around them. The rainbow ring is one sign of glaucoma that anybody can recognize and it should never be ignored. But don't wait for

it to appear. Glaucoma can be discovered by an eye specialist long before the rainbow appears before the optic nerve has suffered any damage. Your sight depends on that nerve's re-

maining healthy. Glaucoma can be treated successfully today with drugs or with surgery, and so blindness can be prevented. The method of treatment depends to some extent on how far the
