

No. Common-law marriages North Carolina. Most states until recent years recognized common-law

marriages. At the present time they are permitted in eighteen States. They are: Alabama, Colorado, Florida, Georgia, Idaho, Indiana, Iowa, Kansas, Michigan, Mississippi, Montana, Ohio, Oklahoma. Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, South Carolina, South Dakota, and Texas.

Common-law marriages, in those jurisdictions where such are authorized, are just as binding as a ceremonial marriage. They can be terminated only by annulment or di-

No. In North Carolina boarding homese for aged persons have almost entirely reand more counties have converted their county homes into the more modern concept of to boarding or rest homes. Food, shelter and such personal services as their needs require are furnished the residents for monthly payments. Who pays for their care?

Some of the monthly payments are made by means of public welfare grants to those needy elderly people who are eligible for such assistance. ister or justice of the peace Persons with private resources pap their own expenses in boarding homes.

Are all boarding homes

No, indeed. They range from simple, small homes to homes for persons with substantial means. One of the services of the county department of public welfare is to assist a person in selecting a suitable home. A person of simple taste would be unhappy in a luxurious setting, and vice
