Mrs. Caroline Walbeck of Miami, Fla., has arrived to spend the summer at her home "Pine Lodge", 1118 Montreat Road.

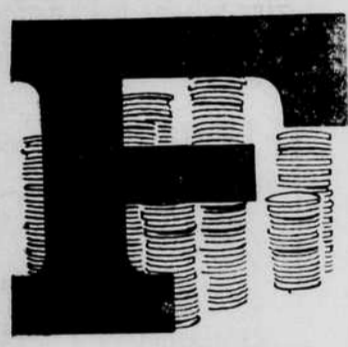

S&H Stamp Book Distributed In This Section

Charles D. Kirby Jr., field representative for the Sperry and Hutchinson Company today announced distribution here of the new S&H Green Stamp catalog, reported to be the most widely-circulated business publication of the year. The initial printing order was for 32 million copies. The catalog will be distributed in this area to customers of Burgess Espresso and Burgess Phillips 66.

Copies will also be available at the S&H Green Stamp redemption center located at 791 Merrimon Ave., Asheville, N. C.

The catalog, which has a book-bind and a firm cover, contains most of the S&H line of 1,700 articles of merchandise. These are illustrated in color on 132 pages. Mr. Kirby said that almost half the items shown are new additions to the line.
