

# SOCIAL SECURITY NEWS

Today, about nine out of ten workers in the United States are covered by social security. Unfortunately, however, many of these people are not receiving the social security credit they deserve for the work they are doing.

The main reason for this is that some employers are not reporting their employees' wages as the law requires—either because they are not aware of their responsibility and liability or, in some cases (strange as it may seem), because they have even been asked by their employees not to make such reports!

The two kinds of work most likely to go unreported by employers are domestic work and agricultural labor. If you employ household help or hire farm labor, chances are that you should be reporting the wages paid to your employees for social security purposes. If you are in doubt about your responsibility for making these reports, or if you would like additional information, please contact the Asheville Social Security Office. Remember that the employer who fails to make a report of his employees' wages for social security purposes is liable for all back taxes due (including the employees' share), plus the interest due, and a possible penalty besides.
