N. C. MOTOR CLUB SUPPORTS PROGRAM FOR TRAFFIC SAFETY

The N. C. State Motor Club today threw its support solidly behind Gov. Terry Sanford's proposed legislative program for traffic safety.

The Governor has asked civic clubs and other organizations to give him their advice on five "action items," which include stricter licensing requirements of teenage drivers, scientific tests for persons charged with drunken driving, additional Highway Patrolmen, additional traffic engineers, and legislation to begin implementing the court improvement amendment to the State Constitution.

He also requested opinion on two items on which no official endorsement has yet been given: legislation to establish a compulsory periodic safety equipment inspection on motor vehicles and requiring the installation of seat belts on all new cars for sale in the state after a certain date.

"The N. C. State Motor Club, which represents more than 100,000 motorists in the state, stands squarely behind Gov. Sanford's efforts to obtain legislation which can serve only to protect the motorist himself," declared Thomas B. Watkins, president of the motor club and the National Automobile Association.
