"Naturally," J. E. Wall, District Director of Internal Revenue for the Greensboro Office, said, "if we can't read your name and address, we can't mark you paid. And we can't mail your refund check."

Southern Invests 70 Million in Equipment

Southern Railway System in 1962 spent or authorized the spending of almost \$70 million for additions to its fleet of diesel locomotives and cars and to continue improving its fixed plant, Southern's president, D. W. Brosnan, said today.

"This multimillion-dollar investment in making Southern more useful to those we serve," Brosnan commented, "is our way of not only wishing our territory a happy and prosperous New Year, but helping make sure that it happens."

"More than \$41 million of that total," he added, "represents purchases of, or orders for, new cost-cutting freight cars design to help us reduce transportation cost for business and industry and lower the cost of living for the public."

Southern's equipment shopping list for 1962 included 1,952 new freight cars, either received during the year or placed on order for 1963 delivery, at a total estimated cost of \$41,481,409; and 60 diesel locomotive unit received in 1962 at a cost of \$13,500,000.

The biggest car purchase and orders were for a total of 870 Super-Cushion box cars (price tag, \$15,680,145) and 600 aluminum-body, steel-underframe, 100-ton-plus covered hopper cars (price tag, \$14,465,000).
