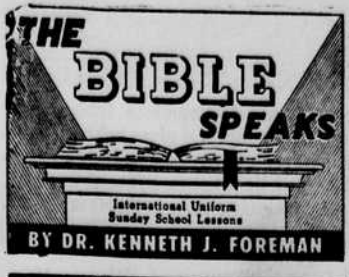

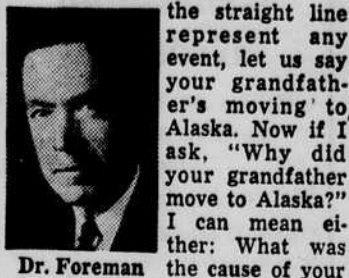

Why Jesus Came

Lesson for October 11, 1964

Background Scriptures: I Timothy 1:12 Devotional Reading: John 10:7-18



WHEN we ask the question 'Why?' we can mean either one of two things by it. One 'Why?' looks backward, the other forward. Imagine a straight line with an arrow at each end, one pointing right, the other left. Let the straight line represent any event, let us say your grandfather's moving to Alaska. Now if I ask, 'Why did your grandfather move to Alaska?' I can mean either: 'What was your grandfather's move?' or, for what purpose did your grandfather move? Now, if we let that line stand for the coming of Jesus Christ to this world, 'Why did Jesus come?' can mean 'What was the cause, what were the causes, or what was the purpose, what were the purposes?' In this week's study we ask the second question. For what purpose did Jesus come?
