## Liquidation **Is Approved** For Mill Here On October 30, 1965, the

stockholders of Black Mountain Hosiery Mills, Inc. voted to liquidate the corporation. The vote was 99.7 per cent, .03 per cent opposed, according to Peter V. Elting, Plant Manager.

The mill, which was founded in 1929, was managed for many years by B. R. Hunter and, for a period, by C. W. Clevenger. In 1960, Mr. Hunter sold his interest in the corporation but he continued as Plant Manager until 1963.


