Mr. and Mrs. Walter Roseboro of Newport News, Va., is visiting here with her mother, Mrs. Kitty Lawton.

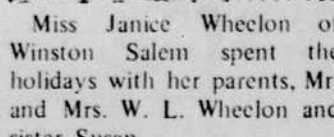

MUSHROOM SAUCE
Cook 1/4 cup minced onion in 3 tablespoons butter until tender but not brown. Blend in 3 tablespoons enriched flour. Stir in 1 cup turkey broth* and 1/2 cup heavy cream. Cook, stirring constantly, until thick. Add one 6-ounce can (1-1/3 cups) sliced mushrooms drained. Season to taste with salt and pepper. Heat. Makes 2-1/2 cups.

*Or you can use canned bouillon or chicken bouillon cubes dissolved in hot water according to the label directions.
