Miss Rebecca Miller served as her sister's maid of honor, and Mrs. Wayne Williams was the matron of honor. They wore

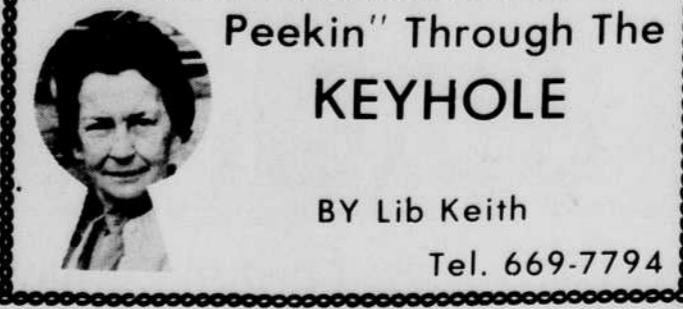
Empire gowns of cranberry red and pale pink trimmed with white lace and pink velvet ribbons. They carried single pink carnations with satin streamers.
