Bones Buried Again

The partial skeletons are believed to have been those of men and women who helped build the Western North Carolina Railroad in the late 1800's. The skeletal remains included leg bones, arm bones, three skulls, a pelvis bone, a shoulder blade, teeth, ribs and vertebra.

Since it was impossible to match the bones, McDowell County Coroner Walton Clapp ascribed the remains side by side in the grave. One skull had an almost complete set of teeth with only one cavity.

Employees of Taylor-Murphy Construction Company of Asheville covered the grave with large rocks until Southern Railway places a permanent marker at the head of the grave.

Clapp said the bodies had originally been buried close to the top of the ground allowing roots to grow inside the skull cavity. He said the state's Chief Medical Examiner, Page Hudson, examined them as belonging to black and white males and black females. He said Hudson determined their sex and race by bone structure.

The bones were uncovered by employees of Taylor-Murphy Construction Company as they graded dirt on a mountain side across from Andrews Geysers to be used to reinforce the railroad banks.

The bones are believed to have been those of prison laborers who helped construct the Western North Carolina Railroad from 1875-79.

History of the construction of the railroad indicates that except for skilled labor, all work was done by prisoners. Seventy-two prisoners are believed to have died during the time.

The bones were found about 60 feet from the railroad track.
