Lynne Blankenship, a Berea College senior from Black Mountain, danced with the Berea College Country Dancers on stage at the Southern Highlands Craftsmen's Fair in Knoxville's Civic Coliseum this past week. Since its beginning in 1948 in Gatlinburg the Fair has included folk music and dance. Now the oldest and largest craft fair in the United States, it has outgrown the facilities in Gatlinburg and moved to Knoxville; but the old folk traditions are still carried on.

Founded almost 40 years ago, the Berea College Country Dancers are a group of students who perform and help preserve the folk dances of Appalachia and other countries, encouraging others to learn folk dancing by holding workshops and programs in churches, high schools, and colleges.

Along with Country Dancer activities, Lynne is the president of the Student Association, she is an honor student, and she is active in various clubs on campus. Lynne is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. J.W. Blankenship, a graduate of Charles D. Owen High School. Her major at Berea College is Child Development.

Hopkins in exercise

Marine Private William T. Hopkins, son of Mr. and Mrs. William W. Hopkins of 404

Pearl St., Black Mountain, recently participated in Exercise "Fortress Lightning" in the Republic of the Philippines.

He is serving as a member of the 7th Communications Battalion, 3rd Marine Division, homebased on Okinawa.

He is one of more than 14,000 sailors and Marines who took part in the two-week exercise, which included 30 ships and Seventh Fleet aircraft, along with elements of the Philippine Navy and Marine Corps. "Fortress Lightning" was designed to provide training in amphibious landing techniques and operations ashore.

"Fortress Lightning" was under the overall direction of Vice Admiral Robert B. Baldwin, commander of the U.S. Seventh Fleet. Rear Admiral James H. Morris, USN, the commander of the Seventh Fleet's Amphibious Force was the tactical commander of the exercise. Hopkins joined the Marine Corps in January 1977.

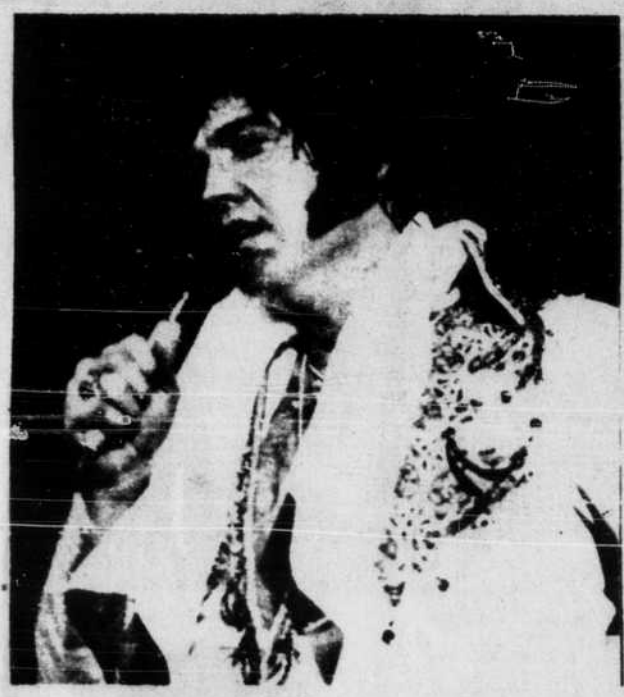
A 1968 graduate of the University of North Carolina, Chapel Hill, with a bachelor of arts degree, he joined the Navy in March 1969.
