Public hearing on combined government

A public hearing on the Asheville-Buncombe Charter Commission's preliminary proposal for a consolidated city-county government will be held at Owen High School June 8 at 7:30 p.m.

Copies of the Charter Commission Report are available at the Town Hall in . Black Mountain.

The Asheville-Buncombe Charter Commission was established in September, 1981 by an act of the N.C. General

Assembly. Local representatives are Dr. Alfred O. Canon, Montreat, and the Rev. Edgar E. Ferrell, Black Mountain.

After five hearings around the county, the Commission will review comments and suggestions made at the hearings and make necessary changes in the charter.

The final plan will be placed before voters in the county and city at the Nov. 2 elections.

Approval of consolidation will require

a favorable vote outside the City of Asheville, a favorable vote by Asheville residents and by the citizens of each town before it goes into effect.

Town Board hires recreation director, proposes 1982-83 budget

Robert Antozzi of Blacksburg, Va. was hired as recreation director by Black Mountain aldermen at a special budget meeting Thursday night, May 26. Antozzi will begin work the second week of June.

A budget proposal of \$949,998 was passed at the meeting on the first reading. Expected revenue, according to the proposal, is \$935,998 for the 1982-83 year, a deficit of \$14,010.

The board voted to accept a bid for a three year sanitation contract with David Young. Young's bid included dumpster service as well as individual garbage pick-up.

The scaled contract is set at \$68,000 for the first year, \$71,000 for the second year, and \$74,000 for the third. The contract will begin July 1. Another bid was submitted by Hyder for \$72,900 a year without the

In other action, the Town Board appointed Bob Watts to the Planning Board to fill a vacancy at the recommendation of that board.


A 1966 Pontiac received \$600 damage May 21 when a CP&L truck backed into it on Ninth Street. The driver was not
