



'Some car models have a better record for resisting crash damage, so they are less expensive to insure and in general they would be safer than cars that would suffer greater crash damage," said Jay Weinstein of Charlotte, a spokesman for the North Carolina Insurance News Service.

'Effective with the 1983 models, insurance rates for collision and comprehensive coverages reflect the past history of the model with respect to crash repair costs," explained Weinstein, personal lines manager of the St. Paul Fire & Marine Insurance range," Weinstein said. 




