LEARNING TO LIVE LONGER.

Life Insurance Companies Are Rated Over the Health Record of 1922—Mortality Rate is 6.4 Deaths Per 1,000 Lives.

New York, Dec. 7.—Life insurance death claims up to November 1 showed that the United States and Canada are experiencing a health record this year almost identical with that of 1921.

Forty-four life insurance companies, which together carried over 83 per cent of the total ordinary business of the United States and Canada, have had a mortality rate in 1922 of 6.4 deaths per 1,000 lives as compared with 6.5 last year, said Dr. Knight.
