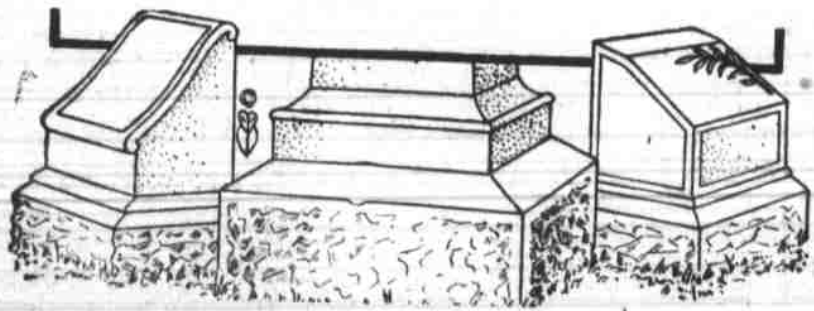

### THE DAIRY INDUSTRY IN CLEVELAND COUNTY

Shows What Can be Done—  
 Mecklenburg and Gaston  
 Counties are Working Too

From Gastonia Gazette:

Last year the farmers of Cleveland county were paid \$180,000 for butter fat by the two co-operative creameries of the county. The dairy industry in Cleveland county is growing and bids fair to become one of the most important of the diversified industries of that county. Not only was this clear profit of \$180,000 realized by the Cleveland county farmers, but in addition thereto was the increased production of crops by reason of enriched soil. It also means more hog and hominy by reason of the by-product, skimmed milk.

These facts are quoted in order to show what the dairy industry will amount to when properly financed and handled. In Mecklenburg county plans are even now under way for the establishment of a large co-operative creamery to handle the dairy products of farmers of that county who have seen the necessity of an organized, co-operative market for their products.

What has been done in Cleveland county and is being done in Mecklenburg is possible in Gaston county. Concerning the dairy industry in Cleveland county, the Star says: "Recently there was organized in Cleveland county a Jersey Breeders Association which has for its purpose the importation of purchased dairy cattle. Little has been done so far in this respect, but great things are in store. Results are slow to show

up, but year after year, progress is made which in a few years will develop Cleveland county into one of the sight-seeing agricultural counties of North Carolina."

### BAD CONDITION IN JOHNSON CITY HOME

Conditions at the Johnson City, Tenn., old soldiers' home, where there are former service men, are so bad that unless congress takes action at once the casualties will be proportionately higher than in the late war, C. R. Forbes, director of the bureau of war risk insurance told a senate committee the other day. Director Forbes brought with him M. T. McNerny, who secretly conducted an investigation for the bureau. The latter told the committee that he bought moonshine whiskey and extract ginger containing 95 per cent alcohol on the reservation, declared that intoxication was common among the inmates and that immoral women overran every section of the grounds. Many of the patients, McNerny said, carried guns and defied the guards to take the arms away. Vendors of all sorts of narcotics, the witness testified, frequented the grounds and sold freely to the inmates drugs of almost every character. Loaded dice and marked cards, he stated, were supplied by "parasites" from outside and patients were drained of the money from the government.
