Another paragraph of the bill provides that the hospital may establish and maintain in connection therewith and as a part of said hospital, a training school for nurses and that the hospital, grounds, furniture, equipment and property thereof, and the physicians, nurses, attendants, persons sick and regulations as the board of trustees may prescribe.
