

HOSPITAL BILL GOES TO RALEIGH PROVIDES FOR \$100,000 BOND ISSUE

Management Will be in Hands of Board of Trustees of 15 Men and Women Elected by Vote

The committee appointed to draft a bill calling for a bond issue of \$100,000 on a hospital in No. 6 township has drafted a bill which has been modified after the county-wide hospital bill drafted some years ago. Representative Peyton McSwain will be asked to introduce it this week at the Special Session of the General Assembly and former Lieut. Gov. O. M. Gardner will remain in Raleigh to see that it is not lost in the shuffle in the Senate after Mr. McSwain gets it through the House of Representatives.

The bill in substance is as follows: The county commissioners shall at their first regular meeting in January 1922, order an election to be held in and for No. 6 township on a date to be fixed by the board to ascertain the will of the qualified voters of said township under the question of erecting and owning a public hospital and issuing bonds in an amount not exceeding \$100,000 and levying and collecting a tax sufficient to pay the principal and interest thereof.

The bill provides for a new registration, that the ballots will read "For Hospital and "Against Hospital" and that if a majority of qualified voters in the township favor issuing the hospital bonds, the county commissioners shall sell bonds not exceeding \$100,000, that the bonds will bear not exceeding six per cent interest, that sufficient tax must be levied to pay interest and create a sinking fund.

ers as trustees of said hospital to serve for a term of six years without compensation. That after the board of Trustees is selected, they shall select a president and a secretary and treasurer, the treasurer to give bond in such sum as the board may fix.
