IREDELL COUNTY WOMAN DIES AT AGE 102 YEARS

The funeral over the remains of Mrs. Margaret E. Lippard, who died in Iredell county last Thursday, was held yesterday afternoon from St. Martin's church by Dr. J. L. Morgan and Rev. D. L. Miller. Death was due to pneumonia. Mrs. Lippard, who had many relatives in Hickory and Catawba counties, was 102 years, four months and 26 days of age, and was a noble Christian character. She was widely known throughout the state.

Her first-born son, William Augustus Lippard, a Confederate soldier, lost his life at Orange Court House, Va. There were 10 other children of whom seven survive. Her descendants number 63 grandchildren, 132 great-grandchildren, and 33 great-great-grandchildren.

TWO OFFICERS KILLED FLYING TO GET DOLL

Captain Harold E. Sturcken, commanding officer of the 47th school squadron at Brooks Field, Tex., Tuesday was killed near Temple, Texas, Tuesday with Sergeant Cyril E. Ryals, when their plane fell, was making a cross-country flight to Dallas to get a doll for his three-year-old daughter for Christmas. The doll was ordered several days ago but had not arrived. Fearing it would not arrive before the holidays, Captain Sturcken obtained permission for the flight to Dallas to get the doll. He was born in New York city in 1894 and joined the army in 1917. He was transferred to the air service field officers school in 1922. He is survived by his widow and two children. Sergeant Ryals was a native of Georgia.
