The booklet is devoted to the apple sections of the State with a photograph of the apple orchard. The quality of the apple sections of the State are found in the mountain and mountain regions where the beauty of coloring has won the names of "Sapphire" and "The Land of the Sky" for a region that is known everywhere as one of the most attractive in all America. Here the highest mountains in Eastern America combine with

sparkling streams and emerald lakes to make scenes of beauty unsurpassed and furnish a perfection of climate that reflects in the richness of the coloring and the lusciousness of flavor found in its fruit. Around Mt. Airy, North Wilkesboro, and Taylorsville in sight of the far famed Pilot Mountain; in the beautiful country around Lenoir and Blowing Rock at the base of towering Mt. Mitchell; in the shadows and sunlight of the Saluda and Asheville ranges; or near by Lake Junaluska's glittering sheen, near Waynesville, are orchard centers whose superior fruit is attested by connoisseurs and many fruit awards. Albemarle pippins, Delicious, Stayman, York Imperial, Winesap, and Rome Beauty, are among the standards; whereas many an old settler declares that the North Carolina Limber Twig has yet to be surpassed when it comes to "Hitting the Spot." Certain it is that few are the earthly places where apple wealth and human health join so happily together. The total apple production according to Federal statistics amounts to 6,000,000 bushels annually.

**Mother of Mrs. Morris  
Dies at Front Royal**

The many Shelby friends of Mrs. M. L. Winsboro, mother of Mrs. J. R. Morris, formerly of Shelby, but now living at Sanford, will regret to learn of her death December 17th at Front Royal, Va. Mrs. Winsboro visited her daughter, Mrs. Morris in Shelby on several occasions and made many friends here. Mrs. Winsboro had never seen a well day since the death of her son, James Winsboro two years ago. Since that time she had been an invalid. She developed pneumonia Monday morning December 17th and died that morning at 10:10. Her body was buried in Prospect Hill cemetery, Front Royal, Wednesday Dec. 19th. Mrs. Winsboro was a woman of fine character and refinement. She was 62 years of age October 15th, born and reared in Greensboro, N. C., where she was graduated from the Greensboro Female college. Surviving are her husband and four children: Mrs. J. R. Morris of Sanford; Mrs. C. T. Robinson of Richmond, Va.; Mrs. C. E. Harmon of Harrisonburg, Va.; and Sda W. Winsboro of Front Royal, Va.

**Shoots Man Who Ran  
Over His Little Son**

Joe Anzalone, shot down at Independence, La., Wednesday by Jesse Stamps after he had run down Stamps' 3 year-old son with an automobile, hovers between life and death in a hospital while the condition of the child, in the same hospital, was unchanged. Stamps was at the bedside of his son. From Independence it was reported that upon his return home Stamps will be arrested and liberated under nominal bail. It was added that citizens from all parts of the Independence territory had offered to furnish bond in any amount that might be fixed. Anzalone at the wheel of a car and with two companions struck the child while driving at high speed and went on without slowing down. Citizens of Independence gave chase and overtook him. Stamps arrived upon the scene after Anzalone had been overhauled and learning the identity of the driver of the car, drew a pistol and shot him through the abdomen.
