REPUBLICANS HOLD CONVENTION HERE

Hendricks, of Marshall, Nominated For Congress, Whitener to Canvass State in His Campaign.

Judge J. A. Hendricks, of Marshall, was nominated for congress by the Republicans of the ninth congressional district in convention here Friday at Cleveland Springs.

Delegates to Convention. J. C. McBea, of Bakersville, was named as presidential elector, and A. A. Whitener of Hickory senatorial nominee, and J. A. VurCannon, of Newland were elected delegates from the district to the national Republican convention to be held at Cleveland Ohio, with Dr. J. Frank Roberts, of Marshall, and J. F. Newell, of Charlotte, as alternates.

In the principal address of the meeting A. A. (Mike) Whitener, of Hickory, declared that he intended to make a canvass of the entire state in his campaign for the United States senate and assured his party supporters that he would make a strong fight for election.

Judge Hendricks, the convention's selection for congress for the district, declared himself in a similar manner to Mr. Whitener, and stated that he would cover his entire district in his campaign and would make as forceful fight as possible.

Many of the delegates from other counties expressed pleasure with the resort hotel and its facilities and quite a number thought likely they would return here for later vacations, being favorably impressed with the hotel and the courtesy of Manager Van Story.

HISTORIC PAPERS IN CORNERSTONE

Open Cornerstone Of Central Methodist Church And Find Bible, Old Papers And Money.

Something of the Shelby of one-half century ago was revealed in the opening recently of the cornerstone of the Central Methodist church on the corner of Marion and Washington streets.

The removal of the relics was made so that they might be placed in the fire-proof vault of the new Central church on the opposite corner. The old cornerstone was at the rear corner of the church on Washington street.

The Bible and hymn book were the best preserved owing to their thicker backs, but the minutes and church papers were in a bad state of decay. Both papers, which were published in Raleigh as there was only one conference then for the state, were of the year 1877, and it is presumed one of them carried a story concerning the erection of the church in that year.

The 25-cent piece of 1857 was placed in the cornerstone by the late Dr. J. W. Gidney, according to information gathered by Rev. A. L. Stanford, pastor of the church. Dr. Gidney was the father of Mr. Lamar Gidney and Dr. R. M. Gidney.

It is desired by officials of Central church that further history of the church and congregation of other years be obtained. Rev. C. F. Sherrill has charge of the work and will appreciate any historic facts or information about the church that older residents may be able to give.

It may be that there are those who attended the laying of the cornerstone and can give further details of it. It is planned to secure the entire history, as much as possible, of the church, congregation and its work, and after being compiled, placed in the fire proof vault of the new church.


