Road Contracts To Be Awarded Soon

One Million Three Hundred Thousand Dollars Worth To Be Let In Charlotte District.

During the next three months contracts totaling approximately \$1,300,000 for the construction of 35 miles of hard surface road and one bridge in the Sixth district, of which Charlotte is the headquarters, will be awarded, according to W. C. Wilkinson, member of the state highway commission for this district.

He expects to leave sometime next week for Raleigh to take up the matter of these contracts in definite and tangible form, he added.

The specific program outlined by Mr. Wilkinson is as follows:

Bridge over the Pee Dee river between Rockingham and Wadesboro, to cost \$300,000.

Eight miles of road, Concord to Mt. Pleasant, cost \$200,000. Contract will be let May 20.

Six miles of road Lincolnton to High Shoals, and 10 miles Lincolnton to Alexis, cost \$300,000. Contracts to be let at an early date.

Eleven miles of road, Charlotte, to Mt. Holly, cost \$325,000.

Six miles from Rockingham to new Pee Dee river bridge, cost \$175,000. Total number of miles, 35. Total cost of construction, \$1,000,000. Total cost of bridges, \$300,000.

Mr. Wilkinson added that already \$9,050,410 in contracts has been let in the Sixth district during the past three years and that many of these roads have been finished. The counties in which this activity has been taking place are Alexander, Anson, Cabarrus, Gaston, Iredell, Lincoln, Mecklenburg, Richmond.

Gardner To Speak At Iredell Picnic

The annual picnic will be held by the Iredell County farmers on Thursday, July 10th, Piedmont Experiment Station near Statesville. Plans for this big gathering of farmers are now being worked out and preparations for a more diversified program including exhibits and demonstrations are being made.

The program will be headed by O. Max Gardner, of Shelby, as chief speaker. Mr. Gardner needs no introduction to the North Carolina farmers and the subject of his address will be on a strictly agricultural subject. Mr. Gardner has made a success not only as a lawyer, but as a farmer in developing his Morpaeacre Seed Farm in Cleveland county.

Mr. F. T. Meacham, chairman of the central committee and Mr. R. W. Graebert as secretary, are calling a meeting of the township leaders to meet on Monday, June 2, for the purpose of making complete plans for the picnic.

Agriculture Supply Bill Reported Out

Measure as Presented to Senate Carries \$60,954,633—Provides for Bull Weevil Fight.

The annual supply bill of the department of agriculture, carrying \$60,954,633, was reported to the senate yesterday. The total is \$11,886,820 under last year's appropriation, but \$3,724,808 in excess of this year's estimates by the budget bureau.

The senate committee increased the appropriation over the house bill by \$4,370,890. As reported the measure carries \$46,300 for investigation and improvement of tobacco growing and handling, an increase of \$4,360 over the house bill; \$186,400 for investigation of insects affecting cereal, including the alfalfa weevil, an increase of \$10,000; \$256,920 for investigation of southern crop insects, including the boll weevil, an increase of \$50,000 with the stipulation that \$25,000 become immediately available \$157,000 for investigation of truck crop pests, an increase of \$12,000.

The senate bill also carries \$452,540 for the enforcement of the packers and stockyards act, an increase of \$225,770 over the house bill; \$550,000 for the enforcement of the grain standards act, an increase of \$50,000; \$186,500 for the administration of the warehouse act, an increase of 23,500; \$549,628 for the investigation of costs of retail marketing of meat and meat products, an increase of \$25,000.
