

"Look at these departments that have been added during these eight years. A 11th grade was added and the courses of study raised so that the school has been placed on the accredited list of high schools entitling the graduate to enter any college or university in the South without further examination. School officials and high school graduates appreciate what this means more than we business men. A commercial department has been added. A teacher training department has been added and in the course of a few years we hope to have a normal teacher training school supported by the state. Eight years ago our main school building had 12 lass rooms. 

Ocean Phone Line Inaugurated Soon

Service Between New York And Lon don On The Ocean Liners By Radio Telephone.

Some time in November a New York business man will lift the receiver off the telephone and speaking ino the mouthpiece will exclaim; "Hello!" says the New York Herald Tribune. At the same instant a London business man will speak into a telephone in the British capital, inquiring, "Are you there?"

This, the American Telephone and Telegraph company announced yesterday, would mark the beginning of regular telephone service between New York and London. And, what works between these two cities can perate just as successfully, in time, ween New York and Paris, Venice Constantinople and Rio De Janeiro.

A dispatch from London printed in vesterday's New York Herald Tribune announced that Great Britain, through its postal department, intended to esablish a 200-kilowatt radio telephone plant at Rugby. It will be similar to hat used for the last eighteen months by the American Telephone company here and the Radio Corporation of America.

What will happen is this: Subscribrs at each end will be connected to their radio stations by wire telephone lines. At the outset the service will depend largely upon atmospheric conditions, which change from hour to hour. But the wireless engineers are convinced they will be able to cope with static within a reasonable length

Then again, on January 14, 1923, the ompanys' president, H. B. Thayer speaking from 195 Broadway, was neard by a group of engineers in New Southgate, England.

The answers from London, however, nad to be sent by cablegram. Next vinter the answer will be instantanous, over the wireless telephone.

Experts have found that owing to udden changes in atmospheric conditions, it sometimes is necessary to use 10,000 times as much power to get sudible speech across the ocean as it is at other periods.

Macarcni Made Of Best Wheat

Somewhat Intricate Process Involved In Manufacture Of Popular Foedstuff.

Macaroni is rated high in nutritive ontent. High grade macaroni is made rom durum wheet semolina, which is produced from the choicest and most utritious part of the wheat kernel

After the semolina is sifted it is mixed with water in a dough mixer. The well-mixed dough is then transerred to a circular kneading machine where it is kneaded until it is smooth n texture and possesses a certain esiliency.

Now the dough is ready to be formed into macaroni. This is done by force ing the dough under hydraulic pressure, about 5,000 pounds to the square inch, through a cylinder with a bronze die at the bottom. This die is full of holes, about a quarter, of an inch in diameter, and each hole has a pin in the center, which is attached to two sides of the hole. The pin forms the hole in the macaroni and divides the dough as it passes through. But, beore the dough reaches the end of the ole, the divided parts come together again and remain so, making a per-

The macaroni is then cut into propr lengths and is taken to the curing oom where it takes from two to five days to thoroughly dry. After the macaroni is thoroughly dry it is packed or shipment.

Spaghetti is made in the same way, except that the holes in the die are smaller and there is no pin in center to form a hollow tube.
