Fred Wright's grainery was blown off the foundation. The barn of Scott Miller was torn

down by the terrific breath of the storm. Luckily two mules in the barn escaped injury but for slight scratches. Other damage included destruction of Beulah Church in Catawba County, which is in the same section.

Reports from other counties west of Lincoln brings news of destruction by the storm. Mr. K. B. Nixon who was in Rutherfordton Monday night reports that many large trees were. twisted and broken by the storm there.




