TRUCK CROPS ARE FEEDING MILLIONS

Enormous truck crops in eastern North Carolina this season have pointed the way to an agricultural renaissance in the section, farm demonstration agents are claiming. Potatoes, beets, cucumbers, peas, beans, berries and early fruits have been marketed by the hundreds of carloads. Prices have been satisfactory it is indicated. Increased acreages will result next spring. The low country farms are capable of feeding several million people. Soil and climatic conditions are so perfect that less labor is required than in some other trucking belts, farmers say.

The early potato crop this year was shipped to a number of the big northern markets, Beaufort, Craven, Pamlico, Wayne and the northeastern counties were among the heaviest producers. Two crops a year are possible in the coastal plain section. The lettuce, cabbage, cucumber, pea, bean and strawberry crops were large. A bumper watermelon crop is coming off shortly. The dewberry production will break all records, it is believed. Dewberries have been grown in new areas this year. In this district and some others the early fruit crops have been unusually heavy. Spinach has been planted in more localities than ever before. The cantaloupe crop, almost invariably good, will be of bumper proportions this season.

With thousands of carloads of truck going to New York, Baltimore, and other big markets and the development of local markets throughout the territory, the truck farmers during the past few weeks have garnered millions of dollars from the "side-line" crops. There are good price prospects for the midseason melon and fruit crop, it is said. The grape crop, to mature in the next few weeks, will be good from present indications. Commercial productions of figs has been started in the tidewater areas. The pecan crop will have a value of several hundred thousand dollars. Kinston is the principal shipping point for these.

Increased numbers of swine will be reported from practically every county this year, while poultry, given little attention by farmers before 1923, has leaped into prominence as a major industry in eastern Carolina. Experts are asserting that the raising of fowls will take third place behind tobacco and cotton in the territory. Dairying has made substantial gains recently. An increased acreage has been planted to corn in many of the counties, it is estimated. This is pointed to by the agricultural experts as "another indication of the determination of eastern Carolina farmers to achieve economic independence. Remarkable gains have been made all around this year."
