SCHOOL BUILDING FOR RUTHERFORD

Rutherford, Nov. 15.—Contract was let Wednesday to Palmer-Snively Construction company of Charlotte, to erect the new \$200,000 consolidated high school building for this community. Their bid being the lowest, \$127,450. This does not include plumbing, heating, equipment, etc. The Carolina Heating company, of Raleigh, was awarded the contract for the heating system. Streeter and Chamberlain, architects of Gastonia, drew the plans for the building which is the latest in equipment and usefulness.

The basement will contain the toilets and gymnasium. The ground floor will contain the rooms for manual training, domestic science, commercial room, cafeteria and upper part of the gymnasium. The second floor will contain library, study hall, auditorium with large stage, six class rooms, while the third floor will consist of class rooms, laboratories, Sewing and millinery room and upper part of the auditorium.

The building is to be of nice face brick and is to be finished not later than November 1, 1925. It will take about a million brick to erect the building. Nothing will be left off to make the building the latest and best.

Mrs. Reuben Lee, widow of the rural policeman who was killed in August, 1923, was presented with a \$25 check by the Ku Klux Klan of the county.

Dr. Chas F. Gold, of Ellenboro, is erecting a beautiful 11-room brick veneered residence, colonial design on the highway towards Chimney Rock. Dr. Gold and family will move here this winter and early next spring will move into his home.

Hickory Man Dies In West Virginia

Hickory, Nov. 14.—E. B. Menzies, of Hickory, federal narcotic agent, was found dead in his room at the Ruffner hotel, Charleston, W. Va., early this morning. Coroner H. D. Good, after examining the body, expressed the belief that death was due

to a heart attack, but ordered that a chemical examination be made of the contents of the stomach.

The body was discovered by a maid, who, when she received no response to her knocks, opened the door with a pass key. Another maid said Menzies complained yesterday of being ill.

Letters in the dead man's pockets revealed that he went to Charleston from Parkersburg to investigate the drug situation in that territory. In his wallet was found several papers with small quantities of a white powder in them. Inquiry among attaches at the federal court building revealed acquaintances of the dead man who spoke of him having been an efficient officer with a reputation for industry and soberness. He had appeared in court here as a witness in cases he had helped in working up. In his wallet were found newspaper clippings relating to cases that he had appeared in. Chief of Police John Britton, who viewed the body before the coroner arrived, expressed belief that death resulted from a heart attack.

DOG ORDINANCE.
