War Veterans Slow To Ask Compensation That Awaits For Them

The Adjutant General of the Army, who is in charge of the administration of the Adjusted Compensation Act (Bonus) for the War Department, announced on the 10th of November that 1,500,000 out of a possible 4,500,000 or, only one out of three of those entitled to compensation, had even asked for it.

There are 140,000 veterans to whom applications have been returned because of errors in preparation and who are still holding them.

Application blanks for this compensation may be obtained through the American Legion, the American Red Cross, all Post Offices, the National Guard, the Organized Reserves, Army Recruiting Stations, and all Army, Navy and Marine Corps posts and stations. All of the above named organizations are prepared to assist in the preparation of applications, without charge to the veteran.

General Davis sums up his three requests to the Veterans, briefly, as follows:

"If you intend to apply eventually for the adjusted compensation submit an application at once. Go to the nearest Recruiting or other Army Station or any Navy, Marine Corps or Veterans bureau for assistance. The advantages of such action are obvious, but the most important of these is the protection it gives your dependent in the case of your death.

If you have no desire to avail yourself of the benefits of the Act, notify the Department to that effect.

If you are one of the 140,000 veterans who have not corrected and returned their applications, please do not delay the necessary action any longer."

Address Properly and Wrap Them Securely

One of the important features in the Shop Early, Mail Early campaign, which is being put on throughout the country by the Post Office Department, is the proper addressing and securely wrapping of Christmas packages. When you wrap your Christmas packages, wrap them securely, put your address in the upper left corner, so, if by chance, it should go astray, it can be returned to you and not sent to the dead letter office. RUTHERFORDTON TO BUILD A CITY HALL

Contract Is Let For \$28,400. City Also Buys A New La France Fire Fighting Truck.

The contract for the new city hall for Rutherfordton was let last week to Mr. C. A. Mooney of Alexis, N. C., the price being \$28,400. The contract for the heating and plumbing has not been let yet. This will cost about \$5,000. Excavation work for the city hall has been completed and actual construction will go forward as rapidly as possible.

The first floor will be concrete. The building will face 54 feet on Washington street and 84 on First street. The entrance to the fire department, water and light offices will be from Washington street. It will be two stories high and of nice brick and stone. The second floor will be entered from First street. It will contain the Mayor's office, clerk's office, vault and five rooms for the fire department and council chamber or auditorium. There will be room in the building for two fire trucks but only one will be used at present.

The building is to be completed by March 1st, 1925. The steps will be of blue granite while the trimmings, cornerstone, cappings, etc., will be of Indian limestone.

The city fathers have also purchased a No. 75, 750 gallon per minute pumper La France engine fire fighting apparatus which cost \$12,500. It will be delivered about Feb. 1, 1925. It is loaded on a big red auto truck with a 105 horsepower engine. A regular man will stay on the job to pump of 1000 feet of hose. It will operate it. The truck will have a pneumatic tires and will be the latest thing in a fire fighting apparatus. No town or city in this county will have anything more modern or improved.

Temperature For Health Below 59

Keep your rooms in winter at a temperature of 68 degrees or less; never more. So says Dr. Joseph Hertzstein, former secretary of the New York state commission on ventilation, in an article "Ventilating Home, School and Workshop" appearing in the December Hygeia, popular health magazine published by the American Medical association. Dr. Hertzstein declares that:

The temperature of the air of a room is the most important factor in practical ventilation, be it in the home, the school or the workshop. This has been demonstrated in many ways. First, air at a high temperature, around 75 degrees, especially when it is moist, interferes with the normal loss of body heat. When air becomes excessively warm the body cannot lose heat to the surrounding air.

Discomfort soon arises as a consequence of this interference with the normal loss of heat. A burden is thrown on the heat-regulating mechanism. An increase in the body temperature in the rapidity of the heart rate, in the rate of breathing, and a fall in the general tone of the circulatory system follows, in fact, the responses of the body to any interference with its normal heat losing function are strikingly similar to those induced under conditions of fever.
