FIRST WOMAN GOVERNOR TAKES OVER DUTIES IN WYOMING -- TEARS IN EYES

Cheyenne, Wyo.—A climax to more than 55 years of equal rights for women in Wyoming came shortly after noon Monday when Mrs. Nellie Taylor Ross, formerly took over her duties as governor of the state. Inaugural ceremonies, Spartan-like in their severity and simplicity marked the induction into office of the first woman governor of any commonwealth in the United States. Calling for "divine guidance" Mrs. Ross, heavily swathed in mourning for her husband, the late Governor William B. Ross, stepped into the place made vacant by his death less than three months ago.

Receives Telegrams. Flushed with happiness and excitement but saddened with the thought of her recent bereavement, the new governor went through a heap of congratulatory telegrams from persons of all walks of life the country over. Included in the list was one from Mrs. Miriam A. Ferguson, of Texas, who after January 25, will share with Mrs. Ross the distinction of being a woman governor. It was a fitting and added tribute to the womanhood of the country that the oath of office was administered by one of the men—Chief Justice C. N. Potter, of the Wyoming supreme court, who on September 30, 1889, drafted the clause granting equal rights to the women of any state for the first time at the constitutional convention held in Cheyenne. A. C. Campbell, another member of the historic convention, witnessed the ceremonies in the senate chamber. Mrs. Ross addressed the assembly in the senate chamber as "my friends," and continued: To Continue Policies. "Owing to the tragic and unprecedented circumstances which surround my induction into office, I have felt it not only unnecessary but inappropriate for me to now enter such discussion of policies as usually constitutes an inaugural. "This occasion does not mark the beginning of a new administration, but rather the resumption of that which was inaugurated in this chamber two years ago. It is well understood, I am sure, that it is my purpose to continue, as I am convinced it is the desire of my state that I
