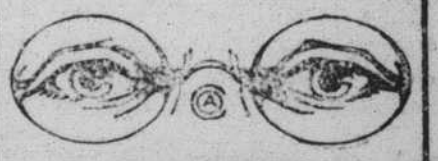

D. E. Rhyne and Others Buy Melville Mills

Cherryville, Jan. 5.—A deal of considerable importance was closed here Saturday when Melville Manufacturing company, a new corporation chartered on January 2 by Mr. D. E. Rhyne of Lincolnton, Dr. W. H. Houser and Mr. W. B. Rhyne of Cherryville. The transfer includes all of the real estate and personal property and everything owned by the seller which composed this modern cotton mill as a going concern together with all the supplies on hand and cotton in process but not the cotton on hand or orders. The new corporation is now in charge of the property and will start operation of the plant next Monday.

The Melville Manufacturing company was organized in 1905 by Melville Bradwell and son Mr. David A. Bradwell who were the active officers with Senator W. A. Mauney of Kings Mountain, as president until the controlling interest was sold to Edgar Loxe and associates of Lincolnton about two or three years ago. The capital was increased from time to time and was \$250,000 at the time of making the present deal. Meaning corporation built its mill No. 2 at Lincolnton. This mill is still in operation and the old corporation will continue in the operation of its business at Lincolnton as this deal has to do with none but the Cherryville property and plant.

It is understood that the deal involved between \$250,000 and \$300,000. This mill has been considered one of the best in town. The business will be carried on from the central office of the Cherryville, Howell and Rhyne-Houser mills.

At the first meeting the following officers were elected: Mr. D. E. Rhyne, president, Dr. W. H. Houser, vice-president and Mr. W. B. Rhyne, secretary and treasurer. The same men constitute the board of directors.

RUTHERFORDTON IN LONG STEP FORWARD

To Pave Sidewalks, Open Streets And Other Moves. Faces Very Bright Future.

Rutherfordton, Jan. 10.—The town council of Rutherfordton has employed the Carolina Engineering company to make a map or blue print of the town. It will show all the streets which have heretofore been located and will show a number of new streets which are to be laid out soon. The map will give the name of all streets, location of property and the owner. All streets will be named and the name placed on a post at the intersection of streets and all houses will be numbered. Building lines will be established and the state laws which require building permits will be enforced and a building inspector will be appointed.

An up to date fire department will be organized with two paid men on the job all the time, day and night. By the time the new city hall is completed the new \$15,000 fire fighting equipment will be ready. Work on the new hall is going forward rapidly. It will be one of the most imposing buildings in town, when completed.

Contract will be let around January for concrete sidewalks for the entire town, which means from five to eight miles.

The fire limits will be enlarged. Court street is being widened and paved. A number of other streets are being paved.

Rutherfordton faces the brightest future in her history. New residences are going up on every hand. All the old dilapidated wooden buildings have been torn down. The town has an ample water supply, sewerage system and a new and up to date white way. The town has two of the best hotels in the state, and eight miles of paved streets.

Roy R. Blanton of Forest City took the oath of office as county solicitor of the recorder's court here Monday morning, succeeding G. W. Edwards. Mr. Edwards has been solicitor for

two years and has made a decided success. He is a member of the law firm of Edwards and Edwards of this place one of the most successful law firms in this part of the state.

A. D. Brabble, of Charlotte, new manager of the Isothermal hotel took charge Sunday. He and Mrs. Brabble arrived here January 1 from the Queen City. Mr. Brabble has already made a good impression on the people of the town and community. Many have met him and all like him. He is painting the interior of the Isothermal and is getting things in shape for the best year the hostelry has ever had. The new Kiwanis club will hold its first regular meeting in the Isothermal January 15 and will meet there regularly thereafter.

W. Spurgeon Bridges, of the Washington section, was appointed rural policeman here Monday by the county commissioner.

Dr. Charles F. Gold, of Ellenboro, who moved here recently opened an office over the W. C. Twitty Grocery company last week and is now practicing his profession.

Appoint Meekins Eastern Judge

Washington—President Coolidge Friday transmitted to the senate the nomination of Colonel I. M. Meekins as judge of the eastern district, to succeed the late Henry G. Connor. During the afternoon Colonel Meekins called at the White House to thank the president for the nomination, and later called at the department of justice to express his appreciation for the recommendation to Attorney General Stone.

Some uncommon and very powerful support came to Colonel Meekins—or Judge Meekins—soon after his name was mentioned in connection with the eastern judgeship. The campaign in behalf of Judge Meekins who will be 50 years old next month, was to a very large extent directed by W. G. Bramham, the Republican state chairman. He received the active support of Chief Justice Taft at every stage of the contest and this may also be said of Representative Theodore F. Burton, of Ohio. Another factor in bringing about the appointment was the support which Judge

Boris To Wed Girl Picked For Wales

London—King Boris, of Bulgaria, often referred to as the "loneliest king in the world" is reported to be engaged to Princess Helena, of Romania, of whom the handsome young prince of Wales is said to have remarked, "She's a good kid."

King Boris is about the same age as the Prince of Wales and in some social circles it is being hinted there is a rivalry between King Boris and the Prince of Wales for the hand of the sixteen-year-old princess. It is not considered probable, however, that there is an actual rivalry between the two men of royal blood although certain royal personages have been most anxious for an alliance between the Prince of Wales and the Princess Helena.

It was reported only recently that such an alliance had been arranged but that the announcement was to be withheld three years, when Helena would be nineteen.

Popular in England. Princess Helena has visited England several times. She was here in December for the opening of parliament, being the guest of her aunt, Infanta Beatrice of Spain. Helena is of a lively disposition, vivacious, a good dancer both in the ball room and classical numbers. She plays an excellent game of tennis and speaks four languages.

In recent months there has been what appeared to be a publicity campaign in her behalf in the English newspapers. Many pictures of her have been printed and several writers have been invited to visit her in Roumania and see her home life.

An ironical touch to the King Boris-Princess Helena romance, however, is the fact that while they are Balkan neighbors they have never met. The engagement is said to be entirely diplomatic, though it is reported that arrangements have been made for them to meet at Nice, France in February.

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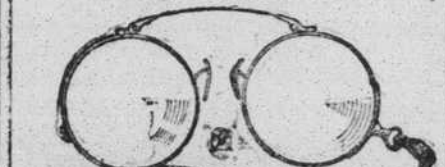
