**TOM JIMISON GETS ROAD SENTENCE**

Charlotte, April 3.—A leaking jug filled with corn liquor today brought about the downfall of Tom F. Jimison, former minister of the Methodist Episcopal church, south, labor leader and a politician of parts, when he was sentenced by City Judge Wade H. Williams to serve a term of 60 days on the county roads on a charge of transporting whiskey. For appearing on the streets in a drunken condition he was fined \$20 and the costs.

Notice of appeal to Superior court was given and Jimison was allowed his liberty on bond in the sum of \$25 which was furnished by Frank Flowers, local attorney.

Jimison was arrested shortly before dawn this morning near the Selwyn hotel in the uptown business section of the city by Detectives R. C. Cato and R. B. Ramsay. The officers testified at the hearing this morning that he was drunk at the time.

The former minister carried a suitcase and a traveling bag in his hands, according to the officers, who testified that they found a gallon jug in the traveling bag and seven jugs of corn whiskey in the suitcase. The stopper in the jug had worked loose, according to the officers, who said they were tipped off by the odor of rum as Jimison passed them. They looked closely and claim they saw the contraband trickling from the bag.

Jimison entered a plea of not guilty when arraigned but did not go on the stand at the hearing. The two officers were the states witnesses.

Jimison, for several years pastor of Methodist churches at Spencer and Winston-Salem, had lived in Charlotte since shortly after his resignation from the Methodist ministry during the meeting of the conference in Greensboro last fall.

For several months he was associated with James F. Barrett in the publications of the Charlotte Herald, a local labor weekly that went to the wall several weeks ago.

Last week he announced that he would publish a weekly paper here in the interest of the labor movement and the first issue of this publication was due to come from the press this week.

Jimison during the political campaign last year was an active supporter of La Follette's candidacy for President, stumping the state in behalf of the third party ticket.

He could not be reached late today for a statement.
