Dr. Wolf states that the most hopeful feature of the whole matter is that the disorder is temporary and that here is generally a rapid and complete recovery under ideal weather conditions for cotton. It is not a disease, states Dr. Wolf, but a growth disorder and though it may affect the total yield of cotton in the field, each plant so affected will generally produce some seed cotton.


