

C. M. Smith, banker. Definite agreement was reached for federal aid, making a total of \$150, 000 for the work.

Cherokee county was promised rehe remaining \$40,000 of the county's \$75,000 by 1930, acording to Mr. Wannamaker.

Commissioner McGowan suggested that the contract can be let August 7. but this date is tentative depending pon the completion of data relating to the project by the state highway department engineers. The route was arveyed several weeks ago.

Mr. Wannamaker expressed the pinion that the contract will be let by the middle of August at the latest, and that work probably will be started by September 1.

When this section is completed twothirds of the distance between Gaffney and Spartanburg will be hard-surfaced. Mr. Wannamaker said the present plans o fthe highway department contemplate having the entire route paved by 1930.




SECTION 7 .- That every person, firm or corporation who shall violate any provision of this ordinance or carry on any business, trade vocation or prafession on which a license tax has been fixed, without having first paid the tax and received the license, shall be liable to a penalty of \$50 for each offense, and each day said business shall be carried on shall constitute a separate and distinct offense.

SECTION 8 .- All license taxes imposed by this ordinance shall be due and pavable in advance, and if any person shall fail to may any license tax required by this ordinance on or before the 1st day of August, 1920; five per cent of the amount of such tax shall be added for each month thereafter. and no license shall be issued until the tax plus the per cent shall be paid. The addition of the said percent on the amount of said license tax shall not exempt the delinquent from the penalties herein prescribed in case of delinquency.

#### ORDERS REMOVAL OF SIGNS FROM HIGHWAYS

Columbia, S. C., July 13 .- Removal of all advertising signs from the sides of state highways has been ordered by Chief Highway Commissioner Sam uel McGowan. Mr. McGowan has instructed the inspectors for the highway department to remove the signs and road forces have been given similar orders.
