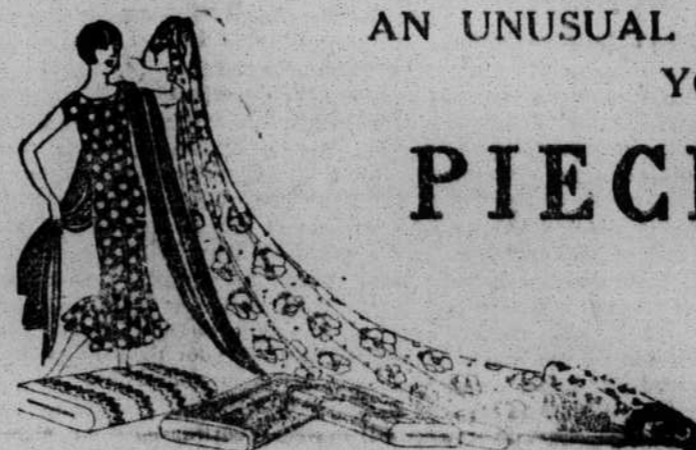

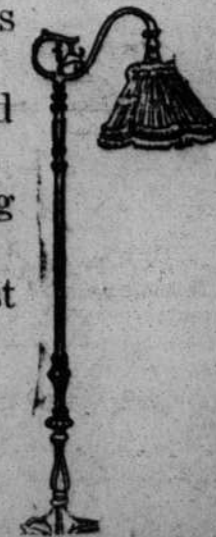

John Temple Graves.
(Charlotte News.)

The death of John Temple Graves, the veteran orator and editor saddens a multitude of hearts. He was one as easy to love as to admire. He was ranked with the greatest of platform speakers that the South has ever produced, and earned for himself a place among the elect editors of his day and generation, moved with facility and grace among the mighty and accompanied with those of title and wealth and honor, and yet he kept his head and maintained the innate spirit of Democracy that in him came in to full flower.

Born a South Carolinian, in the conservative environs of Abbeville, Mr. Graves soon became a Georgian and in that state won quickly for himself the distinction of being the logical successor of Henry W. Grady as orator, writer and leader of the forces of progressive thought and of action.

Although a great editor, the genius of this man was in his oratorical abilities. He has been heard in this community several times as he made the rounds of the chautauqua circuit, his Armageddon oration last delivered here being regarded by himself as the masterpiece of all of its creations.

As an orator he possessed himself with ease and grace on the platform and mellifluous language flowed gracefully from his lips as he painted beauty or denounced vice. He could and did charm the multitudes whether he was speaking his message through his facile pen or his ready lips and death hushed a golden voice when it called, in passing, and beckoned him away.

SPENCER GROCER COMMITS SUICIDE WHEN ARRESTED

Spencer, Aug. 11.—Sending a bullet crashing through his brain, E. Paul Hudnell, aged about 27, until a few days ago a well known Spencer grocer, ended his life before daylight this morning at Great Falls, South Carolina, standing by the side of Chief of Police J. A. Wagstaff, of Spencer. The officer, who went to Great Falls Monday night in search of Hudnell, had just arrested him on charges of larceny of \$2,000 worth of goods from James Ellison and company at Washington, N. C. It was while packing his grip to return to Spencer with the officer that Hudnell fired the fatal shot. He died instantly.

Two companions, in bed in the room witnessed the tragedy enacted, while Chief Wagstaff made a futile effort to get possession of the gun.

The goods from Washington to Spencer was charged Hudnell hauled the goods from Washington to Spencer by truck and sold them at retail.
