## Shelby's Boom as Hendersonville News Sees it Higher Up

Hendersonville News:  
The real estate fever in Western Carolina has descended the hills as far as Shelby, where the Cleveland Springs hotel has changed ownership with William Marshall and son, Alfred P. Marshall, of Clearwater, Fla., listed among the new owners, the former stockholders retaining an interest therein.  
Recent land purchases together with the hotel property give an area of 200 acres, which is to be developed into a colony.  
Shelby is rapidly growing. Cleveland county is wallowing in the lap of agricultural luxury, if such can be said of any farming section. These advantages, with Shelby's location in the highlands, just below the Blue Ridge mountains, will give her further impetus in the development of a resort hotel property, famous for the mineral qualities of its health giving waters from a series of Sulphur Springs, noted for their efficacy for over a century.  
The Shelby Star prophesies as follows:  
Look ahead five years and what do you see along Highway 20 as it winds its black-strip way into the mountains of Carolina; a big resort hotel and summer colony here, Lake Lure and Chimney Rock grandeur. Hendersonville, Laurel Park, Brevard, Asheville. All easily reached from all sections of Eastern America. To see what the future will bring is of sufficient urge to live another half-decade at least.  
The past week was an important one in the history of Shelby. It would be well to check the date on the calendar for it will be the basis of many progressive stories to be told in the years to come.

## Laws Foresees A Crisis Coming

R. Don Laws, the peppery editor of the Yellow Jacket attended the famous Scopes evolution trial in Dayton, Tenn., and comes home fully convinced that this country is approaching a great crisis and calls on the Christian people in the last issue of his paper to awaken before it is too late.  
"Friends of Christian civilization, lovers of law and decency, we appeal to you," says Mr. Laws. "We attended the Scopes trial at Dayton, Tenn., and we learned things there that all our years of study of public, political and social problems never gave us the slightest intimation were going on to destroy all that is sacred and pure and holy in the United States of America. We knew conditions were bad, we knew things were headed for the rocks in many lines, but we had no idea our country held within its borders such flagrant, daring, demonic despicable, dirty enemies of the flag and the Bible as we saw with our own eyes and heard with our own ears. Men, grown men, fellows who vote to make our laws and profess to be leaders in their circles, we heard walking the Main street of a calm, Christian, civilized community, saying 'Moses was a liar, Christ was a bastard!' We saw men who owe their freedom to Christian civilization sitting with a grinning ape at the head of a banquet table, as their honored guest; we saw preachers—God save the Divine commission, openly denying that faith and obedience and the Bible are essential to man's salvation. The pity of this impending warfare is that many so-called Protestant church members and leaders are openly

aligned with the Soviets, I. W. W.'s, Free Thinkers, anarchists, Free Lovers and devils in general to wreck the last vestige of Christian civilization in free America and set up the red rag of revolution and ruin over the Stars and Stripes!  
"We saw Halderman-Julius there, lined up with Darrow, and who openly declares in his widely-circulated weekly, 'I do not regard adultery as immoral.'  
"We saw and talked with William Jennings Bryan, long our political opponent but our patriotic friend. We heard from his lips the record of his undying devotion to the One Cause above politics, power, position or preferment. We never realized that America had so many enemies within her borders, slowly, surely, successfully sapping her life-blood by efforts to wreck the pure streams of intellectual and spiritual life of our citizens, especially our young people. We surmise the Jewish Kallah is back of all this movement. "We heard Malone confess what his fellow Evolutionists have not dared admit. He said:  
"We wish in the beginning to state that we"—he was speaking as the legal representative of the Evolution movement—"believe there is a direct conflict between the theory of evolution and the theories of creation as set forth in the Book of Genesis. Neither do we believe that the sto-

ries of the creation as set forth in the Bible are reconcilable or scientifically correct. We will also prove that there is more than one theory of creation set forth in the Bible and that they are conflicting. Moses never heard about steam, electricity, the telegraph, the telephone, the radio, the aeroplane, farming machinery, and Moses knew nothing about the scientific thought and principles from which these vast accomplishments of mankind have been produced. "The crowd is out to destroy the Bible and supplant it with the Age of Reason. Fellow Americans, do you want to see a goddess of Reason set up in place of the Statue of Liberty! a monkey to take the place of the Divine dictum, 'In His Image'; to supplant our Christian civilization, lust, adultery, licentiousness as sovereigns of our homes and hell at large over this broad empire? If not, then in God's holy name we invoke you to help us get the facts in this issue before every American citizen before the poison has spread and it is everlastingly too late.

brly fellows who walked into their camp (Pullmans were unknown) well armed with pistols. The bride was frightened, but her husband remained calm.  
One of the men demanded that he change a ten dollar bill, which the young man recognized as a counterfeit. When Copelan refused, they began unbuckling their pistols.  
"With all the bravery and daring of a young soldier, my husband reached back as if for a gun and dared them

to shoot," Mrs. Copelan said "I've heard cannon," he said. "Do you think I'm afraid of pistols?" They retreated slowly and finally disappeared.  
The moderate cold of a southern winter caught them before they had reached their destination, and Christmas found them in the Blue Ridge mountains. A family of mountaineers threw open their doors to the travelers, offering them a quantity of peach brandy and wild game.


