A Day in New York With Shelby Native

New York, today is quite different from what it was twenty five years ago. All the best and finest part of the city has been built during the last quarter of a century, since 1990.

Those who know, say the safest place to walk in New York at night is on Broadway-this we did until the Theatres turned out and the busses gathered up their crowds for Chinatown and the Slums of East Side. We started from where 42 nd, St., crosses Breadway one of the most congested centers in the world.
