Mrs. Frank Howell and two little daughters, Donna and Nancy of Homlet, spent a few days last week with Mr. and Mrs. T. C. Wood.

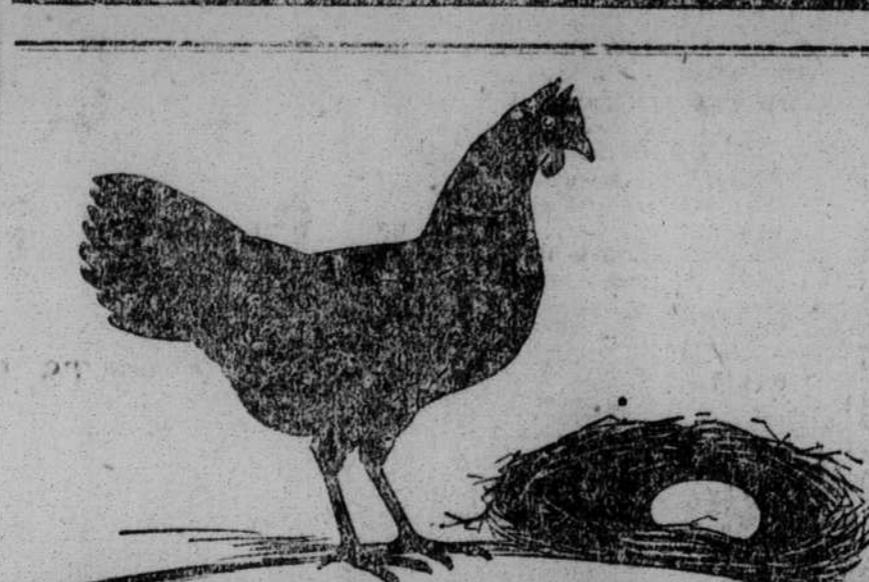
