the blood test which is applied to each bird is for the purpose of determining whether or not it is infected with bacillary white diarrhea, an infectious disease that is transmitted through the cgg to the baby chick, which causes heavy death rate. The disease is very prevalent and causes enormous sses each year. The department believes that this disease can be eradicated by the methods that have been adopted.
