

> **1S COTTON CROP TOO LARGE** ASK CLEVELAND FARMERS

> (Continued Prom Page 1) million bale mark and in those years, 1899 and 1901 the crop was just a few thousand under ten million.

Modern machinery, more intense cultivation and improved methods have made a gradual increase in the yield. The largest crop on record was made in 1914. That year the price ranged from 9.35 to 14.50. In 1912 and 1913 the south made two crops over fourteen million bales and in 1911 there was a 16 million bale crop when the price

ranged from 9.20 to 16.15. Eleven, twelve and thirteen million crops have been in the majority for the past twenty years. 13 Year Record

During the civil war in 1864 a 1. 300,000 crop brought the highest price on record. That year the lowest price was 72c, the highest \$1.90. Since the Civil war the highest price reached in the cotton market was in 1920 when it sold for 43.75 cents per pound. Here is the record since 1914
