Cleveland Native Dies at Bessemer

Mr. Felix Carroll, born and reared in Cleveland County Passes Away at Bessemer City.

(Special to The Star.) Bessemer City, Oct. 14.—This community was saddened when it became known that Mr. Felix Alexander Carroll had passed away on the night of Wednesday, October 6th, 1926 after an illness of four weeks aged 87 years. Until his recent illness he was never known to be sick and was always at his work in the large mercantile business conducted by him and his sons, trading as Carroll brothers.

He was a man of a meek and quiet disposition, a devoted husband and father, loyal to his church and friends. He had many friends who mourn his departure.

The deceased was a native of Cleveland county, being reared at the old Carroll home near Shelby, the son of John and Sara Baker Carroll. Only one brother, J. W. Carroll and one sister, Mrs. Margaret Carroll Sparrow of Clover, S. C. survive him.

He is also survived by his widow, who before marriage was Miss Francis Elizabeth Gantt whom he married 52 years ago. And the following children, Messrs. Ernest and Rufus Carroll, Mrs. H. C. Fronberger, of Bessemer and Messdames Charlie Ware and Bun Patterson of Kings Mountain, Mr. Jos Carroll of Montreal, Canada.

The funeral was conducted from the home on Thursday morning in

charge of Rev. E. P. Stabler pastor of the Methodist church, Mr. Carroll being a member of that church. Revs. R. R. Caldwell, J. L. Teague, George Bowman and other ministers assisted and spoke in the highest terms of the deceased. At his request he was buried in the cemetery here, the grave being covered with beautiful floral tributes, testifying to the love all held for him.

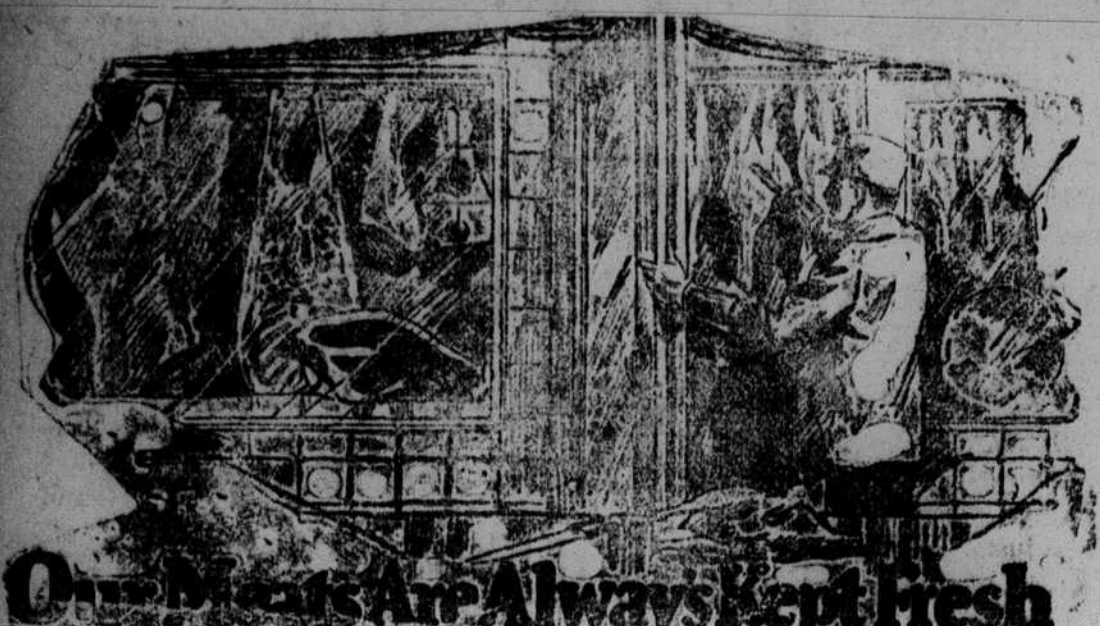
