(Special to The Star.) South Shelby, Dec. 3.—The total enrollment of the Morgan school of South Shelby is 471. Of this number 211 are boys and 260 are girls. The percentage of attendance at the close of this month was 92 percent. Our average daily attendance was 439. There were 74 tardies throughout the entire school during the third month. There were 50 new pupils enrolled during the past month.

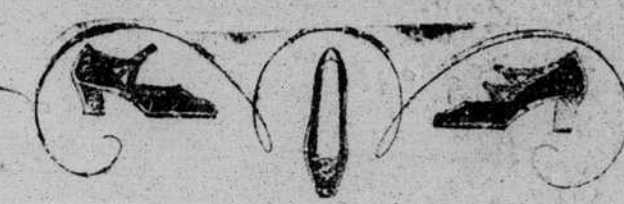
